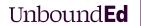
Explore the Five Stages of Curriculum Implementation

Stage	Non-Use	Awareness	Mechanical	Routine	Proficient
Definition	Practitioners are not implementing the curriculum because they may not know about it or actively or passively resist it.	Practitioners know about the curriculum and are not resistant to it, but they aren't implementing it. Often, this is because they are unclear on how to implement it.	Practitioners start to implement the curriculum, but they often feel awkward because they must remember a lot of new information to change their practice.	Practitioners start to become comfortable with aspects of the curriculum. They may implement it in a structured, quick, and easy-to-remember way, but they are hesitant to move beyond that use.	Practitioners have a deep understanding of the curriculum and how to modify it to provide personalized support.
